## **This Ancient Boro Beer Festival 5<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> July 2024**

### **Coppernob - 3.8% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

A medium dry copper coloured ale with a biscuit and caramel maltiness. Kentish Golding, Challenger and Fuggles hops provide a robust hoppy finish.

### **Blonde Ambition - 4.2% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

A fully flavoured, well bittered and refreshing blonde ale. Kent Challenger and First Gold hops provide a crisp, clean tasting, spicy and citrus finish.

### **Rustic - 4% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

A deep bronze coloured, rich tasting country ale. The scarce Kent grown Epic and classic Fuggles varieties provide a smooth, delicate spicy finish.

### **Old Chestnut – 4.4% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

Rich, chestnut coloured best bitter with hints of rye. Pilgrim and Bramling Cross (Kent) hops provide dark fruit and honey flavours with hearty, toasty and slightly tangy malt flavours.

### **Velvet Raven – 5.2% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

Robust, malty English stout. Nortdown, Fuggle and Bullion (Kent) hops provide hints of blackcurrant, spice and grass with toffee, liquorice, chocolate and coffee malt flavours.

### **Te Tau Ihu – 4.5% - Tonbridge Brewery, Tonbridge, Kent**

Pale gold New Zealand hopped ale. Nelson Sauvín, Motueka (New Zealand) hops provide a tropical fruit, gooseberry, zingy citrus and herb flavour with bready, grainy and mid toffee malt flavours.

### **UXB - 4.6% - Wantsum Brewery, St Nicholas at Wade, Kent**

Raspberry Porter. Pleasant raspberry flavours twinned with chocolate roastiness.

### **Ravening Wolf - 5.9% - Wantsum Brewery, St Nicholas at Wade, Kent**

New Zealand IPA. A strong New Zealand pale ale. Toasted IPA biscuit and Rye Malt flavours support a pine lemon hop crispness with a hint of vanilla.

### **Hurricane – 4.5% - Wantsum Brewery, St Nicholas at Wade, Kent**

A refreshing IPA brewed with Mosaic & Citra Hops, this beer packs a citrus punch. Oats in the mash give a smooth mouthfeel and plenty of body.

### **Black Prince – 3.9% - Wantsum Brewery, St Nicholas at Wade, Kent**

A rich, full bodied Kent mild, smooth on the pallet with subtle hop notes.

**Beckets – 4.5% - Wantsum Brewery, St Nicholas at Wade, Kent**

Rich and fruity traditional brown ale.

**Sunday Sessions - 3.8% - McCanns Brewery, St Michaels, Kent**

Inspired by Northern Soul Sunday Sessions - this straw-coloured Session Pale is well-hopped with just Mosaic for a vibrant finish. Expect an easy-drinking, juicy pale, with plenty of berry aroma and notes of stone fruit.

**Speed Wobble – 4.7% - McCanns Brewery, St Michaels, Kent**

Single hop Session IPA. Speed Wobble is packed with a heady amount of Citra Cryo showcasing a subtle burst of passion fruit, mango, citrus and pithy grapefruit. Added Oats to the grist give this little Session IPA a smoother mouthfeel and is super crushable.

**Hoodoo Voodoo – 6.5% - McCanns Brewery, St Michaels, Kent**

West Coast IPA combining the big flavours of Galaxy, Vic Secret and Mosaic to give big tropical fruit hits with a solid resinous background.

**Haffenden – 4.2% - McCanns Brewery, St Michaels, Kent**

A classing best bitter with a hint of caramel and a robust malty finish.

**Bridge Field - 4.8% - McCanns Brewery, St Michaels, Kent**

Caramel Sweetness gives way to a refreshing hoppy bitterness.

**Level Best - 4% - Rother Valley Brewing Co, Northiam, East Sussex**

‘Level’ as it is affectionately known to its loyal drinkers has now been brewed for 22 years. This classic beer is a ripe harvest golden colour, brewed with Phoenix hops, leaving a slightly citrus aftertaste.

**Ruby Wheat Beer – 4.4% - Rother Valley Brewing Co, Northiam, East Sussex**

‘RWB’ A well balanced wheat beer brewed with First Gold and Cascade hops, which give this a unique chocolate-orange taste.

**NIPA - 5% - Rother Valley Brewing Co, Northiam, East Sussex**

Northern Indian Pale Ale. A traditional IPA brewed with the classic English Admiral hops. Golden in colour, it is both bitter and sweet.

**Best Bitter - 4% - Long Man Brewery, Polegate, East Sussex**

Perfectly balanced with a complex bittersweet, malty taste, fragrant hops and a characteristic deep finish. A traditional Sussex Style Best Bitter.

### **Sea Dog – 4.2% - Lister’s Brewery, Patching, Worthing**

Medium amber in hue, this beer boasts toasted malt flavours that add a gentle roasted quality without overwhelming the palate.

### **Best Bitter - 3.8% - Lister’s Brewery, Patching, Worthing**

Traditional in style, but triple hopped giving it a deep and lasting finish. It is amber in colour, full flavoured, balanced and moreish.

### **Spring Forward – 4% - Brentwood Brewing Company, Brentwood, Essex**

New World bitter brewed with Chinook & Centennial hops.

### **Hope & Glory – 4.5% - Brentwood Brewing Company, Brentwood, Essex**

A well balanced bitter with full malt flavours and a lightness of the hops coming through in the flavour, leaving a pleasing end note and lingering bitterness.

### **The Quiet American - 4.2% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Session APA. A light and fresh American Pale Ale that is both floral and citrusy with a hint of grapefruit.

### **Cobnut - 4.1% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Ruby Ale. Generously hopped, dark and nutty, with no nuts involved!

### **Kent Golding Bitter - 4.1% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Light Golding Bitter. A full-on dose of Golding and Fuggles hops for a taste of historic Kent.

### **Extra Stout – 4.2% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Dry Irish Stout. Traditional black stout with a dry-roasted barley flavour and complex bitterness from Kentish hops.

### **Brewers Reserve – 5% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Pale with Attitude. A strong hop flavour of citrus and resin with a delicate malt background.

### **Old Skool – 4.1% - Kent Brewery, Birling, Kent**

Hoppy Best Bitter. A traditional style English bitter – hoppy as it used to be!

### **Blind Faith – 4.8% - Anarchy Brew Co, Newcastle Upon Tyne**

Delicate hints of Pineapple combined with a citrus foundation. A smooth mouthfeel with a flavour encounter of peach and grapefruit with a delicate lingering bitterness.
